

Informational Interchange on Environmental Protection among Local governments in North East Asia Region

Joint Research on Migratory Birds in North East Asia Region

Objective

In Japan, the nationwide research system has been arranged to solve the flying routes of small birds(ex. thrush, *Emberiza rustica*) which come from the Far East or continent.

But, Far Eastern region has not implemented the researches for flying routes between Japan and continents even though the Far East is regarded as bird's breeding area and one of their migrating courses.

Therefore, Joint Research will be implemented to clarify their migrating routes, life span and starting age to breed etc. in cooperation with local governments in the Far Eastern region.

Implementation (It will be continued after 2004.)

(1)Period:

in spring or autumn that the birds start to migrate

(2)Method:

It will be carried out by local governments in cooperation with private organizations.

(3)Research method:

(Method)

- To make plans for Joint Research, such as research areas, method, materials or tools, schedule and etc.
- To select research areas after consultation with local governments and private organizations and implement the Joint Research.
- To accept the youth from Primorsky area. And implement the research and have some cultural interchanges.

(Making a report)

- To make a research report using a common form.

Participation request to local governments

(1)Tasks to be done by local governments participated:

to implement the Joint Research in the Far East and accept the youth investigators.

(2)Participation request for:

local governments in the Far East

(3)Financial cooperation:

- Toyama Prefecture will provide the tools like leg bands, Kasumi-net, decoy birds within its budget.

- As for the expenses of the dispatch acceptance, the travel expense will be borne by local governments dispatched and the living expense during staying will be borne by local governments accepted.
